The cluster can only adopt new issues if there are enough people who want to be resourced on it.

The levels of response are:

- **Strong support** – you are willing to be very active on the issue, such as encouraging others to be active on the issue, willing to organize events in support of addressing the issue, or willing to visit your local MP on the issue.
- **Moderate support** – you are willing to take a higher level of support for the issue, such as writing a letter, attending a forum or rally on the issue or getting others to sign a petition;
- **Minor support** – you are willing to undertake minor actions in support of the issue, such as signing a petition or postcard;
- **Passive support** – you are glad the cluster is working on the issue, but not willing to take action on the issue yourself;
- **Not interested** in the issue;
- **Do not support** work on the issue;

Please tick the box that indicates your level of support for the issues below. You can indicate your support to be resourced on as many issues as you think you have energy for.
