Reviving the Synod Refugee and People Seeking Asylum Network

The past election cycle has ended, and a new one has begun. Advocacy groups are implementing their response to this government's refugee and people seeking asylum policies. And, others will be faithfully continuing their work directly supporting families and individuals in need, as they would have done regardless of who is in power.

At this important time, the JIM Cluster is particularly interested to hear from you if you have experience working with refugees or people seeking asylum. This may be anything from running direct community support programs, to advocating for policy reform.

Congregations have an essential role to play in advocating for, and supporting refugees and people seeking asylum. We recognise and celebrate that there are many long standing arrangements across the whole of the Uniting Church. Some are carried out by individuals, or in partnership with bodies like Uniting and other community organisation.

In the past, the JIM cluster had some success in facilitating a Uniting Church response to improve the conditions of refugees and people seeking asylum. There was an active network of people and congregations we who supported one another. We would like to resume this work with you again. We are seeking to revive an interconnected Synod wide network of people sevring, and interested in serving, refugees and people seeking asylum.
