

## Feedback on Issues we are Resourcing

February 2026

Each year we invite our supporters to tell us which issues they most want us to campaign with them on towards just outcomes. We provided a survey sheet in our October 2025 issue of JustAct, surveyed supporters that came to the 2025 JIM Convention and did an online survey. In total 135 supporters responded to the survey. Below are how the issues ranked based on the feedback we received.

The new issues to the survey is marked in bold. The issues were added at the request of supporters made throughout 2025.

The time we have to work on the above issues will not be evenly spread between these issues. Instead, issues will be given greater priority based on the following factors, as assessed by the JIM Cluster:

- The level of support for the issue as indicated by the table above.
- The degree to which there are immediate opportunities to make a difference on the issue, that would be missed if we did not act on them (for example, a government is consulting on legislation that impacts on the issue).
- The ability of our actions to make a difference on the issue, especially by resourcing you, our supporters, to take action.

An issue may also be given greater resourcing if the Synod meeting or the Synod Standing Committee require us to complete specific pieces of work on the issue.

Based on the feedback from the survey, the Cluster will increase work on curbing support for people with disability and mental health needs and reform of the youth criminal justice system. We will pick up providing resources around curbing poverty in Australia.

The JIM Cluster will immediately end work on peace-building in West Papua.

The Cluster is involved with coalitions of community organisations working on peace-building in Myanmar and curbing the arms trade. Thus, we will wind down our involvement in these coalitions.

We will only work on democratic reforms as they are necessary to achieve reforms in the other areas of our work.

Given the level of support for the following issues in the 2025 survey, we will survey them again at the end of 2026:

- Regulation of aged care;
- Women's rights; and,
- Curbing persecution of the LGBTQIA+ people.

New issues that will be surveyed at the end of 2026 to set the 2027 priorities will include:

- Curbing inequality;
- Regulation of AI; and,
- Curbing militarism.

At least one supporter requested that we add these issues to the next survey.
